Classroom Level Continuum of Responses

Type One Behavioral Violations

<u>Level A</u> – Initial or repeated minor violations Teacher or school personnel:

- Teacher or school personnel reteaches behavioral expectations
- Teacher or school personnel selects and implements a classroom intervention strategy, monitors and documents progress, and modifies or implements a new intervention if not showing success.
- Teacher or school personnel selects and implements restorative justice practices.
- Teacher or school personnel notifies the student's parent(s) or guardian(s).

Administrative Level Continuum of Responses

Type Two Behavioral Violations

Level B – Unsuccessful attempts at Level A or identified behavioral violations.

Teacher or school personnel:

- Continue all Level A interventions
- Teacher or school personnel create a behavior referral
- Attempt restorative justice practices

Administrator or Designee:

- Administration or Support Professional provides classroom support
- Administration notifies student's parent(s) or guardian(s).
- Administration investigates the evidence
- Consider detention

<u>Level C</u> – Unsuccessful attempts at Level B or identified behavioral violations Administrator or Designee:

- Continue all Level B interventions
- Consider In-School Suspension
- Consider Behavior Intervention Class

<u>Level D</u> – Unsuccessful attempts at Level C or identified behavioral violations Administrator or Designee:

- Continue all Level C interventions
- Consider Short-Term Suspension
- Initiate RMT/Tier II referral

Threat Level Continuum of Responses

Type Three Behavioral Violations

 $\underline{\text{Level E}}$ – Unsuccessful attempts at Level D or identified behavioral violations Administrator or Designee:

• Continue all Level D interventions

- Consider long-term suspension (not K-4)
- Initiate a Threat Assessment
- Consider police cooperation

<u>Level F</u> – Unsuccessful attempts at Level E or identified behavior violations Administrator or Designee:

- Continue all Level E interventions
- Consider Expulsion (not K-4)

<u>Level G</u> – Firearm

Administrator or Designee:

- Mandatory police involvement
- Mandatory Expulsion
- Mandatory Threat Assessment

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
